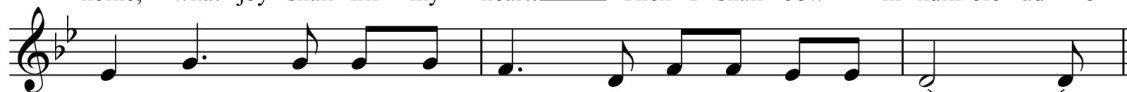

Do you enjoy BBQ grilling?  
Do you want to serve some neighbors in need next Saturday, October 8?



This year as part of our Mercy in Action program, we at St. Mary, signed up to host the Saturday morning outreach activity at St. Aloysius Church on Washington Blvd near State Street in downtown Detroit. We have 2 volunteers, but I think we need about 10 more helpers. Can we count on you? It's easy to sign up using this website address, <https://bit.ly/Mercyday2022> (case sensitive)

We are responsible for grilling about 100 hot dogs & hamburgers starting at 7:30am, setting up the serving line and tables at 7am, serving, and cleaning up afterwards. We have most of the food and clothing items already. We are short on labor. Generally, other groups finish before noon.

In addition to serving the hot food, we will be distributing lunch bags put together by the sandwich makers mentioned in the next column. Each bag will contain a sandwich, snack, treat, and water bottle that the guests can take with them to eat later. Of course, we will be distributing hygiene kits and some hats, gloves, and socks as supplies last. A side note, parking for \$10 is available in the deck across the street and other lots nearby. Therefore, carpooling is encouraged.

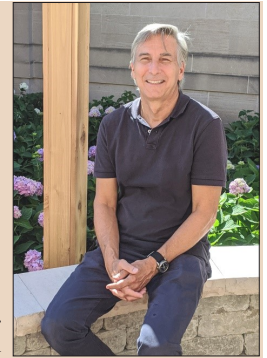

## Volunteer Spotlight Robert Paesano



In his 13 years as a parishioner, Robert has given much of his time in service to the Church. He has been involved in the Amazing Parish Conference, the AOD’s Synod 16, and our Missionary Strategic Planning.

He explains his desire to serve the community in his own words. “After being away from the Catholic Church for several decades, God brought me back through my first wife, Gina, who had suffered the majority of her earthly life with chronic illness. Through Gina’s inspiration, guided by the Holy Spirit, along with reading the Bible, sharing stories of Catholic saints (including saints who suffered and whose bodies were incorruptible), and Eucharistic miracles, as well as other related material; I returned to attending Mass at St. Mary. Once I received the Holy Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist again, I felt I was truly back home. After Gina passed away in 2013, and my retirement in 2014, my faith continued to grow and I was moved by the Spirit to volunteer as a lector and assist with RCIA. The graces and blessings I’ve received from God as a Catholic revert have been wonderful and hard to put into words. In 2018, the Holy Spirit led me to my wonderful and present wife, Joy, a devout faith filled woman, who had also been widowed. This past year, we were both able to help facilitate a class for the RCIA candidates. We have received countless blessings from them and they have inspired us to draw closer to Jesus through their desire to learn the Catholic faith.

During the last couple years, I’ve been given the opportunity to serve at Funeral Masses, and feel fortunate to be able to assist the Priests as our brothers and sisters transition from this temporary life to eternal life. 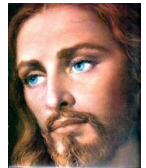

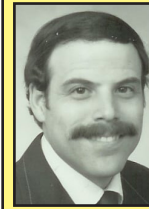

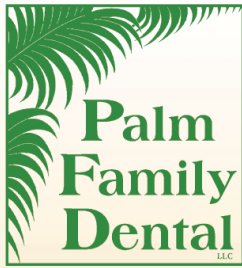
