

#### From Fr. Paul

We begin anew this first Sunday of Advent, and this first Sunday of the Church year, as we enter into a time of expectation, hope, and renewal: Advent. Together we are waiting with expectation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus, when God became one of us to save us. We are also all waiting for Christ's return at the end of days. Our



Worship, the Liturgy of the Church, redirects

our minds and hearts to the reality of preparing our souls to stand before God. So often when we celebrate Mass, we hear the words, "We await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ."

I invite you to live Advent this year. So often we can forget the season of Advent because we are already celebrating Christmas. I think that sometimes we are looking for an escape from the challenges of our lives and our world and want the joy of Christmas now – the celebrations, the decorations – so we start celebrating Christmas in November. Our Church offers us something refreshing – a time to pause and a time to be renewed in hope. Live Advent.

We can choose to move from a focus on the busyness of this time of year and all that we think we need to accomplish, to a time of "Awaiting the blessed hope." Remember, the people of Israel waited for generations for a Messiah, Mary waited months as the Divine Child grew within her, the Magi waited until they saw the star to set out on their holy journey, and Advent teaches us to wait as well. There is a beauty to be found in the waiting. Live Advent.

Advent is also a time of silence. If we really want to hear the Lord we will need some silence. I invite you to spend guiet time with the Lord this Advent. You could spend time a few minutes each morning reading a chapter of the Gospel of Luke, or you could read it together as a family each evening. If you start on December 1<sup>st</sup> you will have read the entire Gospel by Christmas Eve. As an alternative, you could read the daily Mass readings each day and hear over and over a call to be ready for the Lord. You might light candles of an Advent wreath (four candles will work just fine if you don't have a wreath) for a short time each evening and spend some time in prayer. At church, we have Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesday evenings (except December 6<sup>th</sup>) from 7:30-8:30pm or Friday morning from 6:30am-7:15am. You can spend the hour (or even a short visit) with Jesus in quiet. Invite Him to speak to you. The Sacrament of Confession or Reconciliation allows us to receive the gift of God's forgiveness and is the perfect way to prepare our soul for Christmas. Live Advent.

There will be plenty of time to celebrate Christmas, but we can do our best in this busy time to prepare for Jesus and live Advent.



### The First Sunday of Advent

### First Reading - Isaiah 2:1-5

This is what Isaiah, son of Amoz, saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come, the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills.

All nations shall stream toward it: many peoples shall come and say:

"Come, let us climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths."

had known the hour of night when the thief was coming,



- St. Patrick Senior Center...empowers the elderly to live independently with happiness through programs of education, health and socialization, giving last support and dignity to the quality of life
- St. Aloysius Neighborhood Services...distributes clothing and hygiene items to the working poor, homeless, and seniors living in downtown Detroit.
- Pope Francis Center...provides meals, support services, crisis response and housing assistance to Detroit community members in need. On an average day, 200 guests are served in this facility.
- St. Vincent de Paul Justice Initiative Prison
  Ministry...volunteers reach out with hope to the
  incarcerated while they are inside and after they are
  released. They minister to their physical, emotional
  and spiritual needs with mentoring, pastoral services,
  food, clothing and other forms of support to enable
  them to effectively transition into society.
- Mary's Children Family Center...a pre-vocational community program where adults with brain injuries/intellectual and developmental disabilities either from birth or acquired come for six hours a day to participate in a structured program designed to improve functional independence and enhance their quality.
- Another Way Pregnancy Center...exists so no woman or couple feels the need for abortion.
   Programs focus on sexual integrity, fetal development, ultrasounds, parenting, adoption resources, material support, and opportunities for personal growth and restoration.
- Sanctum House...A sanctuary for women survivors of human trafficking, where 24/7 housing, healthcare, dental care, education and so much more is provided.

"Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God." (Isaiah 40:1)





### St. Mary Religious Formation


The next In-Person Session will be Sunday, Dec. 4, 2022, with Fellowship at 10:00 a.m. and sessions beginning at 10:30 a.m.
